During the past year, in Manchester, according to the report of Henry L. Wilson, dealer of weights and measures, there were 1,779 different weights and measure examinations of which the number 88 were condemned while 22 were condemned for repairs.

This is considered a very fair record, so that persons who make purchases of certain articles can feel assured that their interests have been well taken care of and that all weights and measures are in good condition.

Concerning the 22 which were condemned for repairs it is interesting to note that half of this number were gasoline pumps. However, in all these cases, there was no fault attached to the merchant or manufacturer, but to the user.

Gasoline pumps and oil tanks were condemned for the reason that they were not cleaned out before being put into service.

"Time Means Life!" Is Slogan of Evangeline Booth In Rallying The Salvation Army for Japanese Relief

Commander Evangeline Booth has mobilized the vast resources of the Salvation Army throughout the United States for two simultaneous campaigns in the interest of Japan.

The first is for at least \$1,000,000 in cash to be true money, with the second to be used to help relief stations established by the Salvation Army and the Japanese Government in Tokyo and Yokohama.

To meet the Japanese emergency adequately, and to make both clothing and cash available, Commander Booth has summoned to her head quarters at New York the officers who were instrumental in the conspicuous success of St. Valentine's Army service to Japan.
