

U. S. Senator King Warns Germany

RED WAVE WILL SWEEP OVER GERMANY HE SAYS

American Testoman Tells Felix Deutsch That World Blames Teuton Industrialists For Present Difficulties.

Berlin, Oct. 4.—United States Senator William H. King of Utah, who has just returned from a tour of investigation in Russia, warned Felix Deutsch, German capitalist and industrial magnate today that a red wave of Communism would sweep over Germany unless working and living conditions were improved soon.

King had a long talk with Deutsch and accused the industrialists of maintaining a policy that would eventually wreck the nation if continued in effect.

Deutsch is right, but that he himself framed the red terror was inevitable in Germany if things were not returned on their present path. King grew warm in his excitement, jumped to his feet and stepped close to the German magnate speaking a long forefinger in his face.

King said he fully believed this, but could not see why it should be an excuse for letting things drag instead of getting the best brains of the nation together to make a solid, constructive program and carry it out.

PHILADELPHIA SALOONS DEFLYING PINCHOT'S DRASTIC CLOSING LAW

Philadelphia, Oct. 4.—The doors of saloons are flying and the glasses are filled while the brass bands gleam with their usual brilliancy today in the city here despite the expiration of the Pinchot ultimatum ordering the removal of all bar fixtures and the cessation of business as usual by noon today before yesterday.

The dry forces are threatening an injunction to prevent the saloons from reopening for the contact of business but so far no action has been taken.

Business at all bars took a negligible lull last night.

Foreign Diplomats Demand Shantung Governor's Exit

Shanghai, Oct. 4.—The foreign diplomatic body at Peking has strongly demanded that the Chinese Government of China immediately take steps to dismiss Yen Tehung, governor of Shantung Province, as a result of his indifferent attitude regarding the kidnapping of last May when train bandits captured several foreigners and subjected them to severe indignities.

According to the same reports, the collective body of the diplomatic corps which will be presented late today will insist that the Chinese government comply in every way with the foreign demands in connection with the kidnapping.

The recent answer made by the Kung cabinet to the foreign diplomats is not taken seriously by the latter, who claim that China is not showing sincerity in its efforts to prevent further outrages being committed against foreigners in this country.

INDIANS TO RACE IN CANOES ON HOCKANUM RIVER TOMORROW

The scenes of two hundred years ago on the Hockanum River involving New England three centuries ago.
