WALTON WARNS INVISIBLE POWER MUST END OR STATE WILL TOPPLE

State Capitol, Oklahoma, Oct. 11.—On August Fourteenth, I declared martial law in Tulsa County when the state of Oklahoma will be subjected to "invisible forces" and the final results of which are bound to be disastrous. Governor J. C. (Iron Jack) Walton held the special session of the Oklahoma legislature when it assembled here today. He renewed his challenge to the K. K. K. with a demand that Oklahoma forever cease from her maddest hooded gatherings, which he blamed for many outrages, resulting in military law and virtual rebellion of civic authority a week ago.

The text of the governor's message follows: "Gentlemen: October Sixth, 1928, I issued a proclamation concerning the members of the Minutemen Oklahoma legislature into extrajudicial session and you are now here to respond to that call. "The reasons for calling you together are well known both to the members of this body and to the people at large. They grew out of conflict in this state between visible and the invisible government, so-called. This conflict must now be brought to a close with a complete victory for the visible government, or Oklahoma will face judicial turmoil and strife. The final results of which are bound to be disastrous.

Ne Threat "This is not a threat, but a statement of fact. "It ought to be apparent now to all citizens that the people of this state will not cravenly submit to intolerance, prosecution and outrageous violence of a hooded organization which operates in the dark and under cover and whose membership is secret. Racial and religious bigotry and mob violence are unthinkable when practiced and practiced in the open—they become traitorously and wickedly so when hidden behind the American flag. "Not only do we have the right to demand that the government and nothing less will satisfy the people's demand; their will; my will. "I urge you to do your duty. "J. C. WALTON, Governor of Oklahoma."

BRITISH LABORITES FEAR UNEMPLOYMENT MAY HURT ORGANIZED TRADE UNIONS

London, Oct. 11.—Will unemployment kill trade unionism in England? That is a question that many serious-minded Labor leaders are asking themselves. "The presence of a large number of unemployed men, in the employes' hands, the strongest weapon to weaken the position of men who work," warns J. R. Clynes, Labor M. P. Clynes declares that unless the Labor organizations grid their steps to aid in bringing about an end to unemployment, that employers can undermine the power of unions and bring workers into an entirely subservient frame of mind, through sheer fear of lack of employment.

Further charges were made by Clynes that the Government has created such rules and regulations for drawing unemployment relief that it has actually deprived many of benefits to which they were rightfully entitled. Clynes and other Labor leaders are diligently striving to arouse the rank and file of working classes to a demand for a more active part on the part of the Government to end unemployment, for they fear that unless unemployment is ended it may end trade unionism and the labor movement.

LOYD GEORGE SAYS ANOTHER WAR IN EUROPE IS CERTAIN

London, Oct. 11.—Former Premier David Lloyd George's warning of another great war in Europe unless the European nations are halted in their military preparations, will be sounded in his speech in the United States. It was revealed today by the British statesman himself. He made the announcement before starting for Niagara Falls. Lloyd George's speech in London evoked a profound impression upon the press. The British overseas dominions and United States work to prevent a new conflict unless the British States are generally accepted as a bulwark to France, which country has built up the strongest military machine in Europe.

The former premier made it plain that he believes the League of Nations, as now constituted is useless as an agency for maintaining peace.

GERMAN REICHSTAG WILL BE ADJOURNED

Berlin, Oct. 11.—The Reichstag today adjourned until Saturday with the authorization law not being passed. Following this adjournment still unpassed Chancellor Stresemann declared that if the law is not passed by the Reichstag tomorrow Saturday, he will proceed to make all decisions upon his own responsibility. The authorization measure confers dictatorial powers upon the government.
