

## GIANTS TAKE 3d GAME 1-0

**Coolidge to Ask Governors Assistance in Adoption of Sweeping National Dry Law**

**ORGANIZE GREAT MAN HUNT TO GET BANDITS WHO DYNAMITED S. PACIFIC TRAIN KILLING**

**Five Severe Recommendations to Be Placed Before White House Conference On October 20—Drug and Immigration Bootlegging Also Receive Attention.**

Washington, Oct. 12.—A sweeping national dry law is the chief suggestion which the Coolidge administration will advance before the Governors conference at the White House on October 20, it was learned here today.

The plan, worked out by the Prohibition unit on the basis of recommendations submitted to all state governors, calls for the coordination of federal and state agencies in gathering up the loose ends and strengthening the weak spots in the nationwide enforcement system.

Postal and railroad authorities and detectives are enroute from San Francisco and Portland to the scenes of the crime to aid in the search through.

This plan, worked out by the Prohibition unit on the basis of recommendations submitted to all state governors, calls for the coordination of federal and state agencies in gathering up the loose ends and strengthening the weak spots in the nationwide enforcement system.

Chief recommendations for the formation of the code are:

1. That the "padlock system" be used extensively to close up establishments violating the Prohibition Act.

2. That state authorities assume a more active and active part in conducting dry raids.

3. That the "bootlegging attorney" and co. be made severely liable for violations, as heavy fines.

4. That purchases of contraband goods be dealt with as serious as other offenses.

5. That no speed and preference be given to liquor cases in the courts.

Based on these recommendations, two other important subjects, and only two, supressing of the dope traffic and "bootlegging of immigrants," are on the program of the conference which is to open to-day, the officials said.

President Coolidge, in outlining the program, has made this point emphatically clear:

## LABOR CONDITION

Certain classes of labor have been receiving the main benefits of the war, so prosperity which has come along with the war is reflected in higher manufacturing costs and necessarily higher freight rates, both of which tremendously increase the cost of living.

The situation is manifestly unbalanced when the average farmer working an entire season receives, say, twenty bushels of wheat or corn, and the average worker receives, say, \$10 per bushel, or \$17 gross for a year, in contrast to a plasterer who receives \$12 to \$18 net for his day's work, or the auto mechanic who receives \$1.00 to \$1.25 per hour.
