Bonn, Germany, Oct. 27.—The Rhineland secessionist movement is hopelessly split, it was admitted today by Joseph Smets, one of the chief leaders. Smets is bitterly disappointed. He violently denounced the other leaders, including Hans Derten and Joseph Mathes. "I will have nothing in common with that gang," declared Smets after the correspondent had mentioned the names of Derten and Mathes. He declared there was a schism in the separatist movement, claiming, on the contrary, it was "hopelessly split."

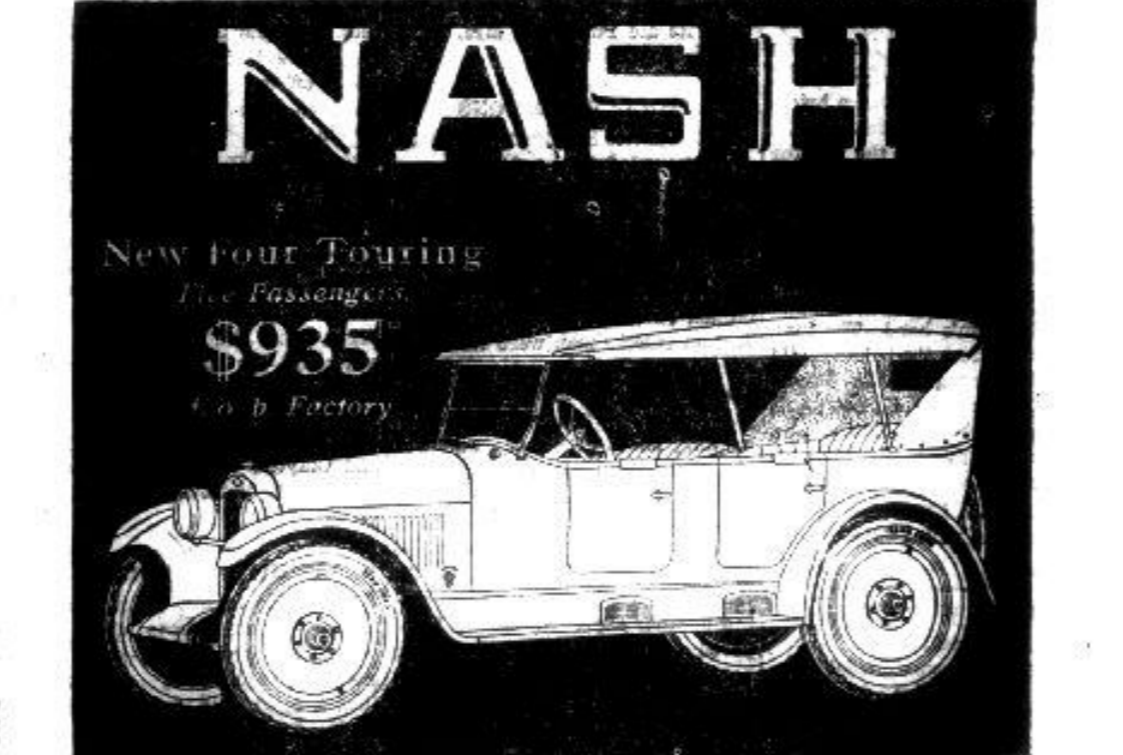
