Conference Negotiations Between France and Britain Near Deadlock

Poincare's Adherent Stand For Germany's Present Capacity With No Reference to Ruhr Status Peeves London Cabinet—Britain Opposes Limitation of Committee Personnel—Paris Government Squarely Behind French Premier.

London, Nov. 6.—Negotiations between Great Britain and France over the proposed international conference of Reparations Experts was seriously near a deadlock today. Great Britain is considering Premier Poincare's reply to the British representations which was in the form of a letter headed by Louis Creu, British Ambassador at Paris.

America's "Last Word" Concerning Conference Has Been Given France

Washington, Nov. 6.—The Reparations Conference spotlight shifted back to Paris today. Premier Poincare presumably has under consideration America's "Last Word" concerning the proposed parity, it was said at the State Department today, and until there is some reply from him, the question of American participation must remain unanswered.

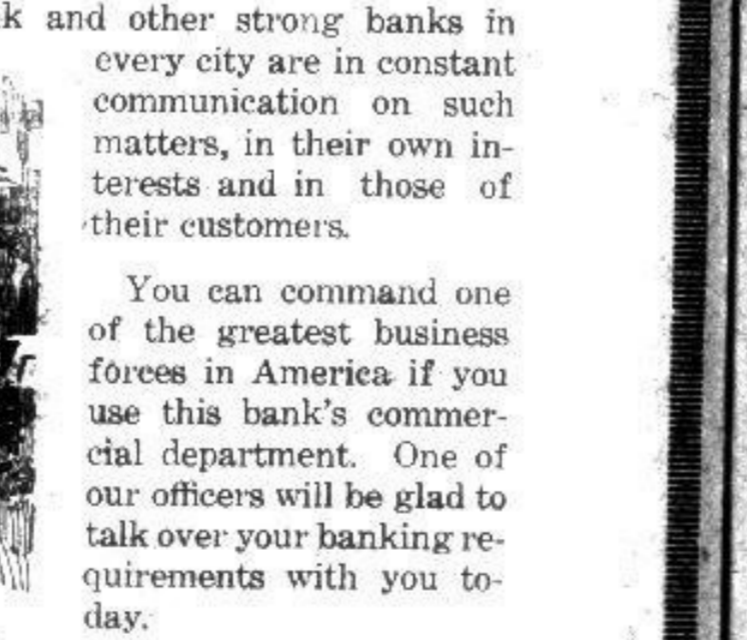
