Washington, Nov. 8.—Congress

will be asked to appropriate \$20,000,000 for a coast guard fleet

The Coast Guard plan will be presented to Congress separately from the regular budget estimates of governmental expenditures which are transmitted early next month. The wide question of more vigorous governmental action in the checking of illicit liquor at their source will be up to Congress for disposition.

THE PRESS  
There is no more positive source of originating fire than the woodchips, coal, woodpiles, or even heaps of leafy coal.

Fires are caused by coal dust, by gas, by oil, by kerosene, which frequently produces explosions from accumulated gases.

Spontaneous combustion is more likely to be found in stored refined coal, for which it is the best fuel for some time.

All this applies to storing soft coal. Alternate wetting and drying of coal that is received we should avoid.

A few general suggestions and precautions for preventing fires in storage of wood will suffice. Fuel wood should never pile up without large air spaces between the sticks, which causes fire to spread.

The ground around the woodpiles and in the areas between should be kept clean, free from shavings and other materials. When burning coal stored there should be easy access to hydrant service and if piled in the house, hose and nozzle should be convenient.

WEATHER FORECASTING HAS LONG AND VARIED CAREER

In connection with the modern system of weather forecasting, the world has learned to expect and to depend upon its accuracy and history. Definite weather forecasts depend upon the rapid collection of the reports of meteorological observations taken at places of interest throughout the entire territory. This process was not of course possible before the invention of the electric telegraph, says the United States Department of Agriculture.
