

TWO BOMB EXPLOSIONS ROCK PHILADELPHIA TODAY

Philadelphia, Pa., Nov. 23.—Two terrible blasts from explosions in the downtown district this morning injured scores of persons and caused thousands of dollars worth of damage in the southern section of the city.

The first explosion was in the Spanish consulate at 201 Pine street, and the second was in the Sons of Italy Bank building at Broad and Packer streets.

Thrown From Beds. Members of the families of the consuls were thrown from their beds by the force of the blasts.

Immediately after the first blast hundreds of people formed in the streets around the wrecked building.

A police dragnet has been placed around the city and a man here for the bombers has been started.
