

DR. ALBERT ABANDONS PLANT TO FORM NEW GERMAN GOVERNMENT

Writes President Ebert It is Impossible to Organize Party Agreeable to All Factions—Was Intensely Opposed by Socialists.

Berlin, Nov. 27.—Dr. Heinrich Albert today gave up his attempt to form a new German government. He was talked by the intense opposition of the Nationalists.

In a letter to President Ebert, Dr. Albert said:

"I have done my patriotic duty in trying to form a new ministry, but it was impossible to form a political party group cabinet that was satisfactory."

Albert's letter was prepared in a room in the Reichstag building. He was accompanied by his secretary, Dr. Ebert.

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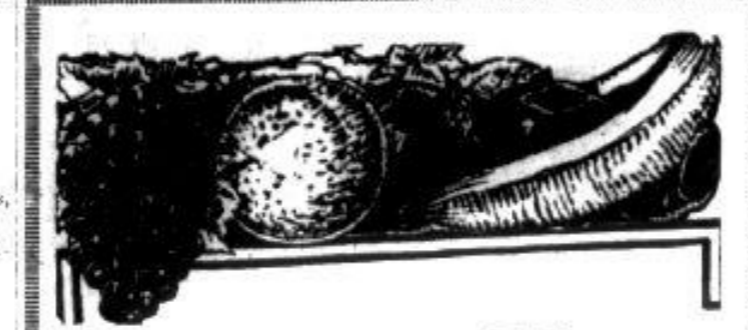
