LENROOT'S RESOLUTION URGES
U. S. ENTRANCE TO WORLD COURT

DENBY RECOMMENDING SWEEPING NAVAL GUN ELEVATION PROGRAM

First Step Toward Carrying Out President Coolidge's Recommendation Taken in Senate This Afternoon — Would Take From League of Nations Right to Elect Judges and Give Function to Hague

Washington, Dec. 10.—A sweeping program for the modernization of the American Navy, including the proposal of an international convention to increase their strength, was recommended today by Secretary of the Navy Denby in his annual report to Congress.

An initial appropriation of \$6,

000,000 to elevate the big guns, was made by Congress about a year ago, but the work was never started because of a misunderstanding with the League of Nations.

Denby said today that the Navy had recommended to the League of Nations that its right to elect judges and give function to the Hague

Convention be taken away from the League.

It was referred to the foreign relations committee without a debate.

Lenroot's resolution would take away from the League of Nations entirely the right of electing judges, which it now has, and leave the general function to the diplomatic representation at the Hague.

The resolution reads:

"That the Senate, shall not be taken to involve any legal relationship on the part of the United States to the League of Nations, or the League of Nations to the United States under the covenant of the League nations, constituting a part of the Versailles treaty."

Second section:

"A second section will be that all nations, not as members, but which would accept the annexed provisions should be permitted to join in the future."

The third section of the bill would divide the member nations into groups, the British empire, France, the United States, Italy, Japan, Germany and Brazil, forming the first group, and known as "Group A" and all other members states to be known as "Group B."

U. S. BRINGS 12 MILE LIMIT DISCUSSIONS TO NETHERLANDS GOVT

Washington, Dec. 10.—President Coolidge today sent to Congress a special message endorsing the comprehensive program of the National Advisory Committee for Economic Development to extend the civil and military aviation in the United States.

FACTIONAL STRIFE LOOMS AS OHIO PRIMARIES NEAR

Cleveland, Dec. 10.—Although primaries for the selection of delegates to the national political conventions of the major political parties are five weeks away, and the primaries at which State delegations will be nominated will be held more than three months later, political knives in both Democratic and Republican camps in Ohio are being whetted for use in the bitter battle expected to precede selection of national delegates and gubernatorial candidates.

A schism in the Democratic ranks has developed, State newspaper reporters say, when Judge David L. Rockwell, formerly close to ex-Governor James M. Cox, will nominate him for President in 1928, while William Gibbs McAdoo, the Democratic nomination, Governor "Vic" Donahue, serving his first term as Democratic chief executive, will encourage all-out opposition to Cox's nomination. Political observers say, as a result of these attributions made to him at the "dry" conference in Washington called by President Coolidge.

Easterners are exercised over saying that this time he would vote for the re-election of President Coolidge rather than support Governor Al Smith, of New York, or Senator Robert M. La Follette.

Back in the shadow cast by the Ohio Statehouse, Governor Donahue has had and said nothing of the sort and that if it was not intended for publication, he probably did not intend it.

On the other hand, the Republicans are reported to be as anxious as ever to nominate their candidate as a result, and further fuel is added to the flame by the already existing enmity of Edward H. Taft, prominent Cleveland and Youngstown lawyer, who fought Donahue's election in the closing days of the 1922 campaign.

Cox Still Strong.

While former Governor Cox is expected to cast his Democratic delegates to the National Convention if he wants it, the selection of Rockwell is admitted to be serious. However, friends of Cox say he can't be sure that Rockwell's election in the closing days of the 1922 campaign.
