

LENROOT'S RESOLUTION URGES U. S. ENTRANCE TO WORLD COURT

First Step Toward Carrying Out President Coolidge's Recommendation Taken in Senate This Afternoon — Would Take From League of Nations Right to Elect Judges and Give Function to Hague

Washington, Dec. 10.—The first step toward carrying out President Coolidge's favorable endorsement of the League of Nations and the World Court was taken in the Senate this afternoon when Senator Lenroot, Republican of Wisconsin, a new member in the foreign relations committee, introduced a resolution proposing American entrance with "certain restrictions and reservations."

No Debate On Bill

It was referred to the foreign relations committee without debate.

Lenroot's resolution would take away from the League of Nations entirely the right of electing judges, which a new law would give the function to the diplomatic representatives at the Hague.

The Resolution

The Lenroot measure reads: "Resolved, that the Senate advise and consent to the ratification of the statute of the permanent court of international justice, but not the optional clause for compulsory jurisdiction, provided however that such ratification shall be upon the following conditions and understandings to be made of the instrument of ratification:

"1. That such ratification shall not be taken to involve any legal relationship on the part of the United States to the League of Nations, or the assumption of any obligation by the United States under the covenant of the League of Nations, constituting a part of the Versailles treaty."

Second Provision

A second provision was that all nations, not now members, but which would accept the amended provisions should be permitted to join in the future.

The method of election covered as a third provision in Lenroot's bill would divide the countries into three groups, the British empire, France, the United States, Italy, Japan, Germany and Brazil, forming the first section, to be known as "Group A" and all other members states to be known as "Group B."

DENBY RECOMMENDING SWEEPING NAVAL GUN ELEVATION PROGRAM

Washington, Dec. 10.—A sweeping program for the modernization of the American Navy, including the raising of a substantial sum to increase their firing range, was recommended today by Secretary of the Navy Denby in his annual report to Congress.

An initial appropriation of \$5,000,000 to elevate the big guns was recommended.

Denby recommended that the Navy should be authorized to raise the firing range of its big guns to 40,000 yards, and to increase the weight of the shells to 10,000 pounds.

18TH AMENDMENT WILL NEVER BE REPEALED, LOCAL PASTOR STATES

Rev. Joseph Cooper Gives Forceful Sermon in South Methodist Church — Points to Benefits Obtained Since Passage of Dry Law — Firmer Application of Law by Police and Courts Still Needed

Rev. Joseph Cooper, pastor of the South Methodist Church in a forceful sermon yesterday declared that in his opinion the 18th Amendment had brought many benefits to the United States and that it would never be repealed.

A total abstinence movement was necessary and harmful to the United States, he said. He pointed to the benefits obtained since the passage of the 18th Amendment, including the reduction of crime and the improvement of public morals.

Cooper stated that the 18th Amendment was a necessary and beneficial part of the Constitution, and that it would never be repealed. He urged the application of the law by the police and courts, and the support of the community.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 10.—Work of organizing the United States Senate was blocked this afternoon when a deadlock developed in the voting to confirm the selection of Senator Albert B. Cummins, of Iowa, as chairman of the Senate Interstate Commerce Committee.

Unanimous Consent Refused

Unanimous consent to the proposal to retain Cummins in the chairmanship was refused through an objection raised by Senator Burton K. Wheeler, Democrat of Montana, who stated his objection was directed against the naming of Senator Cummins as president pro tempore of the Senate, a position he held as chairman of the committee.

On motion of Senator Joe Robinson of Arkansas, the Democratic leader, all the committee assignments made by the Republicans were confirmed except that of Cummins, and a separate vote was ordered.

First Ballot Failed

The vote on the first ballot for the chairmanship was Cummins, 41; Wheeler, 2. There were 57 Senators voting, making it necessary for the winner to receive 41 votes.

Second Ballot

The second ballot was immediately ordered.

Cummins, 39; Smith, 39; La Follette, 1.

The total, 84, necessitated a majority of 43, and it was decided to adjourn.

The third ballot was Cummins, 41; Smith, 39; La Follette, 7.

The same lines of division were maintained as on previous ballots.

After the third ballot, Republican leaders called a halt. Senator Lodge moved to go into executive session for the confirmation of Presidential appointments and the fight was postponed until tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock.

The vote for La Follette was cast by Brookhart, Franer, Howell, Magnus Johnson, Nash, Norris and Shipman.

Senator La Follette was absent and Senator Cummins and Smith did not vote.

All other members voted according to party lines.

U. S. BRINGS 12 MILE LIMIT DISCUSSIONS TO NETHERLANDS GOV'T

Washington, Dec. 10.—Continuing its efforts to extend the American three mile limit to 12 miles to insure stricter enforcement of the national prohibition act on foreign ships, the United States has opened negotiations with the government of the Netherlands with a view to concluding a treaty similar to that with Great Britain.

The British treaty has not yet been signed, but in the meantime the State Department will endeavor to negotiate other pacts with the principal maritime nations of the world.

PROBING WRECK WHICH CLAIMED TOLL OF NINE LIVES

Prove Removal of Bodies

A coroner's probe, to determine why bodies of the dead were removed from New York state into Erie and to give a verdict on the death will get under way and will terminate at a coroner's inquest at the railroad office tomorrow.

The Interstate Commerce Commission also is expected to conduct an investigation.

The Forsythe grade crossing already this year has been responsible for 14 deaths.

Coolidge Endorses Development Of Civil-Military Air Program

Washington, Dec. 10.—President Coolidge today said in a special message endorsing the comprehensive program of the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics for the development of civil and military aviation in the United States.

The president called attention to the report which declared that "the development of civil and military aviation in the United States is the most important of the nation's problems."

Among the recommendations of the committee was the establishment of a Bureau of Civil Aeronautics in the Department of Commerce.

The Advisory Committee is headed by Charles D. Walcott, secretary of the Smithsonian Institution, and includes Dr. Joseph S. Ames, of Johns Hopkins University, Major General Mason M. Patrick, chief of the Army Air Service, Rear Admiral William A. Moffett, chief of the Navy Bureau of Aeronautics, and other prominent officials.

The attention of Congress, President Coolidge said in transmitting the report, is invited to the conclusion of the committee's report which outlines constructive recommendations for the development of civil and military aviation.

"I wish especially to endorse the recommendations of the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics for the development of civil and military aviation in the United States."
