

CONSUL OF MEXICO IN ST. LOUIS REPUDIATES OBREGON GOVERNMENT

St. Louis, Mo., Dec. 13.—Pascual Alvarez, Consul of Mexico here, today announced he had repudiated the Obregon government, and had sworn allegiance to the De La Huerta government.

He declared his action would be followed by other consuls throughout the United States. Alvarez issued the following statement: "The personnel of the Mexican consulate in St. Louis has resigned to the Central Government of Mexico and has accepted appointment from De La Huerta who heads the present revolution."
