

Bolshevism Threatens to Rise in Mexico if Turbulent State of Conditions is to Continue

Contradictory claims come from Federal and Rebel Strongholds—Flores and Raal Madero Prepare to Launch Separate Revolts Big Battle Imminent Near Apizaco.

Widely contradictory claims, some of which had the appearance of propaganda, came out of Vera Cruz and Mexico City today, regarding the source of news in the turbulent Mexico.

It was reported that Gen. Angel Flores and Raal Madero, brother of the assassinated president of Mexico, were preparing to launch separate revolts against both the Obregon government and the Huerta rebels. A civilian army numbering about 8,000 was said to have gathered at the gate way to Mexico City, awaiting orders to seize government buildings and public buildings. Mexico City is defended by 2,000 loyal soldiers and their commander, Gen. Ansona, said to be ready to fight to the last ditch.

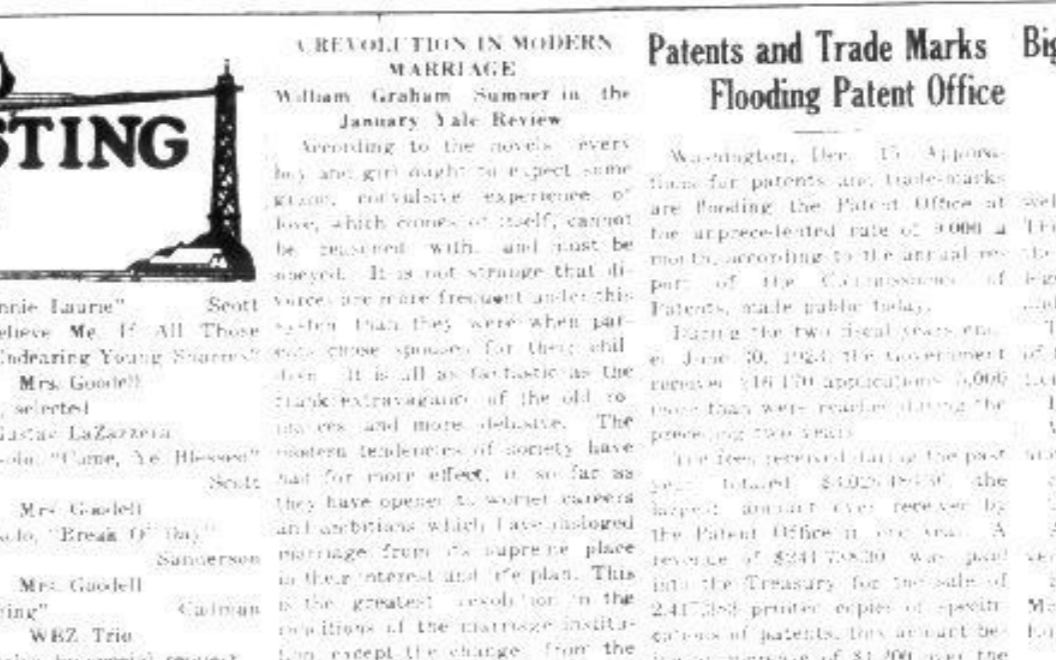

Responsibility is more than an empty word, as the darkness dawned when they were liberated. The colored folks were helpless when they were set free. They didn't have any plans for the future. Now, had it not been for their past day's meals were given to them. They didn't have to hunt for any job, or think of tomorrow.

Individual Responsibility
The life of today is a life not only of freedom but of responsibility. "Individual responsibility" has a great deal to do with the welfare of any nation. The men and women of tomorrow are the happy, care-free children of today. They have no responsibility but they suffer any carnalment in their pleasures. The parents are expected to shoulder the responsibility of their children. Life is a matter of responsibility from one year to the other.

When a man wanted to make "profit" for himself he pushed his stock with another and created a monopoly. They didn't have any real responsibility in their business. They were only trying to get the most out of their employees and give the least they could in return.

Follow the Golden Rule. The Golden Rule is now being used to create more spirit and more responsibility in the hearts of their co-workers. "The laborer is worthy of his hire."
