WHOLESALE PRICES SHOW SOME DECREASE

Washington, Dec. 19.—While retail food prices jumped one point in November as compared with October, there was a drop of one point in wholesale prices of 40 commodities, the Department of Labor announced today.

During the year ending November 15, retail food prices increased four percent, while wholesale prices decreased 2.2 percent. For the ten-year period there was an increase of 11.2 percent in retail food prices.

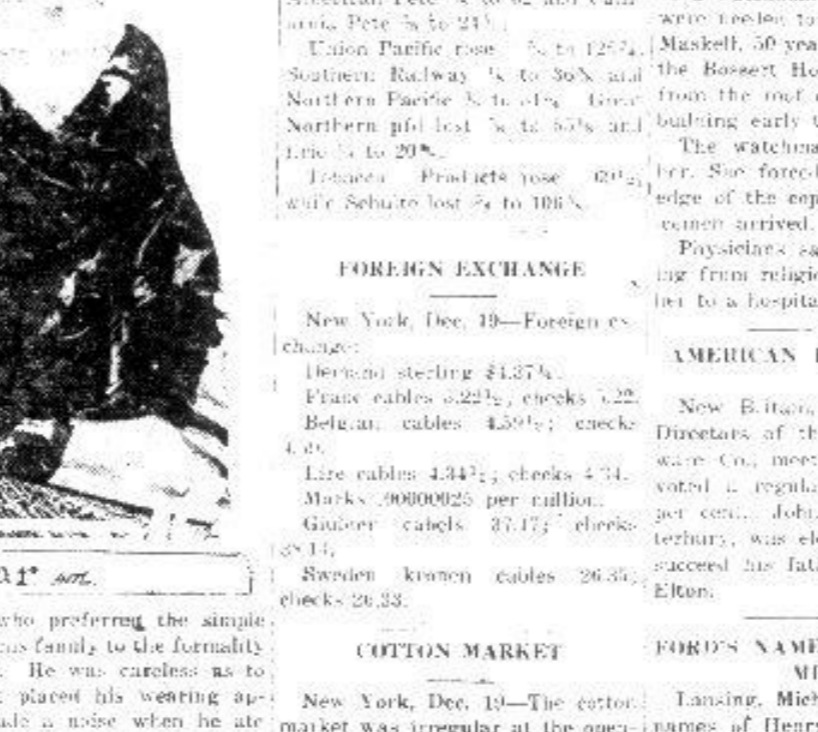
