VERA CRUZ TO FALL IN FORTNIGHT SAYS OBREGON

Mexican President Reports Capture of 2,000 Revolutionaries—Five Day Battle Being Waged for Santa Lucrecia With Odds in Favor of Rebels in Insurgent's Report

Laredo, Texas, Dec. 26.—Julianico will be totally subdued in ten days and Vera Cruz in the hands of the federal government in 15, started a message from President Obregon to the Mexican consul here today.

Two thousand revolutionaries were captured in recent fighting at Puebla, the dispatch said.

An unconditional truce emanating from Nueva Laredo, reported Obregon spreading terror among his adversaries with the general order ahead that all captured commanding officers be executed.

Vera Cruz, Dec. 26.—A 5-day battle has been raging at Santa Lucrecia between Federalists under the command of General Juan Dominguez and General Bravo Iguerre and Revolutionary forces commanded by General Perles and General Benito Terrero.

Heavy Federal Casualties Federal losses are said to be twice as heavy as the Revolutionary.

Santa Lucrecia is a town of high strategic importance as it is the junction of the Vera Cruz, Tehuacan and Puerto Mexico railroads.

Adolfo De La Huerta, the Revolutionary chief, is preparing for a combined assault and fresh artillery and cavalry are being sent to the front.

Although denied by the Mexican City press the Revolutionary leaders maintain that Governor Felipe Carrillo, of Yucatan, has been captured by the Insurgents.

Polar Expedition To Give Uncle Sam More Territory

Washington, Dec. 26.—More than a million square miles of new territory may be added to the United States as a result of the Navy's projected expedition into the Arctic Circle, it was declared at the Navy Department today.

The big expanse of land—most of it covered with ice—is believed to lie between Alaska and the North Pole, and its relation to the United States is the same as that of the continent of North America before Columbus.
