HIGHWAY RESOLUTIONS

At the annual meeting of the American Association of State Highway Officials, held in New Orleans, resolutions were passed on the following subjects:

1. Recommended that Congress appropriate \$100,000,000 per year for a three-year period for the Federal aid to state highway construction.

2. Recommended that Congress appropriate \$100,000,000 for Federal aid to construct eleven thousand miles of surface highways annually until the Federal aid system is completed.

4. Congress is urged to make provision for an early completion of the topographic mapping and the geological mapping of the United States.

5. It is recommended that the Federal aid to state highway construction be expended on the 7 percent system of highways which is the national system of highways.

6. Congress is petitioned to direct to the Secretary of Agriculture the equipment and supplies now in storage and not necessary for the needs of the Army.

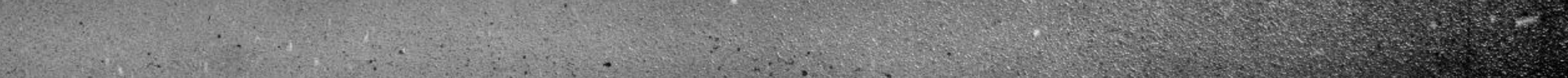
