5 ARRESTED FOR BIG CHICAGO MAIL ROBBERY

Chicago, Ill., Jan. 15.—Five men have been arrested and a series of countrywide secret indictments have been returned, Federal authorities announced today, in the solution of Chicago's greatest mail robbery mystery, the \$150,000 United Depot robbery in March, 1921.

Postoffice Inspector Robert Mueller and two picked up the men at the first of the robberies, Indore Golders and Louis Kretzer, brothers-in-law, both jewelry brokers.

Golders and Kretzer were taken before Federal Judge Cliffe and furnished each half of \$100,000 each.
