MASONIC HOME FILLED TO LIMIT

Need for Addition Seen by Fred Verplank, Head of Foundation in Annual Report—Hospital Favored for Medical Cases—Generosity of Order and of Eastern Star in Past Year Meets Commendation.

There were 20 entertainments given by lodges, Eastern Star chapters, Fellow Craft organizations, and the Soldiers' club of Allington hospital, West Haven. Concerts were given by the Merion Military band, Sylvia Gorton band of Hartford and the Pyralis temple band of Bridgeport.

The main building at the Masonic home at Wallingford is filled to capacity and conditions point to a need for an addition, said Fred A. Verplank, head of the foundation of the Masonic charity foundation of Connecticut, in presenting his report at the last meeting of the foundation, Wednesday evening, at the Masonic temple.

The building originally contained 110 beds. Four additional rooms were made available during the past year. There are now 178 members in the hospital. The beds and attendants number 36. They are approximately based in the main building.

Of the 178 members at least 50 are hospital cases. They need daily, in a greater or less extent, the care of a nurse or physician. The members are served in their rooms. Many do not leave their rooms. A number cannot leave their rooms. During the last year our hospital has been the last entirely overflowing of 30 percent. The ratio of hospital patients has increased steadily. These facts seem to indicate that the addition should be a hospital.

The president said that a stand and hospital was not required any more. It should be a building permanently for the care of aged people. Such persons should be cared for comfortably and at the least possible expense of energy on the part of the nurses. There must be adequate room for the type of patient who should be in the hospital. Rooms for the physicians in attendance, head nurse and the other nurses must be provided. Mr. Verplank named the following: 1. A new hospital building. 2. Commercial traffic through the canal in the calendar year ending Dec. 31, 1923, exceeded that in any previous year, and consequently, the number of commercial vessels making the transit through the canal in 1923 was 6,077. Their aggregate net tonnage was 24,777,347 tons. They carried 25,160,545 tons of cargo and paid \$22,966,838.18 in tolls.

Our Defense At Panama

Colon, Panama, Feb. 8.—The Panama Canal, vital link in America's defense system, is in the opinion of army and navy authorities, undermanned, under-equipped, and in need of many auxiliary accessories are insufficient.

The 5-3 ratio for which the United States put up a fight at the conference table, is in effect tripled and the activity of our two billion dollar navy decreased as a consequence, it is estimated by these authorities.

To really be a first-class sea power the United States must have a fleet of ships that can at all times operate as a strictly offensive weapon. Therefore, it is a prime requisite that the forces assigned to the defense of the canal be able to carry out this defense task without assistance from the navy.

The 48-mile defile running across the isthmus, from one ocean to the other, is an important link in our defense system, and it is possible for the Atlantic and Pacific fleets to form a junction whenever a contingency arises.

Failure on America's part to properly defend the canal, army and navy men say, would mean: 1.—That the fleet would be split in two. 2.—That our two billion dollar navy would be reduced to the status of a second-class power. 3.—That American commerce in other oceans might be threatened or destroyed without the navy being able to prevent it.

Civil Service Favors Frazier's Bill For Postmaster Examinations

Washington, D. C., Feb. 8.—When asked today "What is the attitude of the United States Civil Service Commission toward Senator Lynn J. Frazier's bill to place first, second and third class postmasters in the competitive class?" William C. Denning, President of the Commission said:

"In its annual report to President Coolidge, the Commission recommends the classification under the civil service law of such postmasters. It said that such classification is in line with the policy of putting more business into the government and it accord with the most enlightened thought of the country."

"Under an executive order, the Commission holds examinations for postmaster appointments. The Commission holds the highest three eligible to the Postmaster General. From that list the Postmaster General may select any one for nomination by the President for the usual four-year term. The Commission's duty ends when it sends the names of the eligibles to the Postmaster General.

"An examination system would not be entirely satisfactory if it were not entirely removed from postmaster appointments. The present half-and-half system brings a great deal of criticism on the part of the public, because few people understand just what the crofters do for the postmaster.

"The most important factor in this question is that the removal of postmasters from the competitive class would mean a loss of the efficiency of the Post Office. The postmaster is liable to be removed just as he is becoming familiar with his duties and therefore of real value. This is a palpable waste of time and money. Private business could not survive such a system."

"The Post Office Department probably touches the people more intimately more often than any other department of our government. The government should make it worth while for men and women to specially prepare themselves for the important position of postmaster. Classification under the civil service law is the logical method. The Civil Service Commission is not sponsoring any particular bill but favors the principle and hopes that Congress will enact the President's recommendation into law."

London, Feb. 8.—Civilization is collapsing in Europe, says H. G. Wells. The famous British writer says the decline has been going on for some time and is now becoming more and more apparent. "The cash and credit system is breaking down," Wells declared, "and soon all Europe will be itself burying into the rapid which has swept away the educational and middle classes in Germany and Russia. All the nations must get together in reconstructing currency and reducing debts to avert disaster."

NEW YORK, Feb. 8.—Because bootleggers can offer a better price on whiskey than legitimate importers can, it became necessary to ship back to England 9,000 cases of fine old Scotch whisky, valued at \$1,000,000. The wet goods were stored in a Brooklyn warehouse. Importers who had hoped to sell the whisky to legitimate dealers in medicinal liquors brought it into this country through legal channels in 1921. They found illicit competition so strong it was defeated.

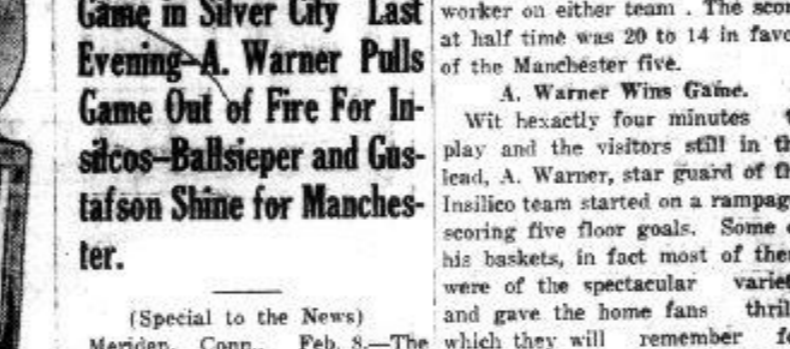

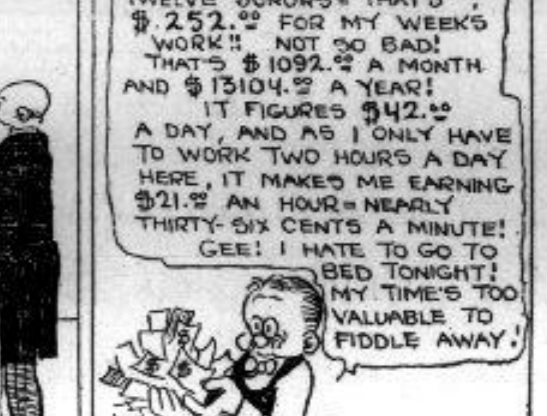
