BAUER MURDER... STILL A MYSTERY

New York, March 31.—The slaying of Mrs. Mabel Bauer, pretty young mother of two children, is a mystery that still remains unsolved. The police in Staten Island today promised to go down in police boats to solve the murder of Andrew Hickey, 32, popular war hero, who was slain on his doorstep late Saturday night. The woman had slipped from a bus with Hickey a few minutes before his body was found flung by five bullets.

Frank Hickey, Linden police captain, brother of the slain man, advanced as his theory for the murder. He said the murderer must have been a woman because of the nature of the crime. They questioned John A. F. Swanson former editor of the "Sun" and "Morning News" and other persons who were connected with the case.
