USES OF THRIFT.

Are there no blessings for man in prosperity beyond the material joys of easier living? Shouldn't prosperity mean more than the thought "Will it last," than an opportunity for extravagance and dissipation...

But what does all this really mean to us? Merely more money, more comforts, more pleasures? Alas for us as a people if we fail to see in our bountiful plenty the responsibility to our better selves which this prosperity has put upon us!

And others carefully use them as means to develop their own minds, to broaden and sweeten their sympathies, to educate their children, to lend a helping hand to the weak, to soothe the sorrowing, to make the home wholesomier and happier, to build schools and hospitals and churches, to grasp the joys that must perish with themselves but to create those leaving human forces that shall endure forever.

CONGRESS NEEDS PROBING.

When the country's press asked congress whether it was a legislating or an investigating body, certain anti-administration senators took violent exceptions to the interrogation. They demanded of the public if it was not their duty as the representatives of the people to probe to the bottom the reports of widespread corruption in Washington.

In one voice the public agrees that the oil reserve and Daugherty scandals should be prosecuted to the utmost ends of justice, but was it impertinence on the part of the public to inquire if there was not legislation of equal if not more importance before congress?

Perhaps there was some vindication for the legislative paralysis in the first few weeks of oil exposures. All could be excused for not being in the mood to consider legislation at such a time.

But today the senate has a Daugherty committee and a Teapot Dome committee and a stack of important business which will be dispatched before adjournment only by some miracle. Let the senators do their "oil spouting" committee from now on, and permit constructive work to go on in the legislative halls.

The everlasting raving in the senate by Senators Hefflin, McKellar and some others on matters which they joined in sending to committees for investigation and report can do nothing toward the clearing away of the clouds of corruption and it is materially hampering the program of legislation. Speeches which would be both libelous and seditious outside of the District of Columbia, and of value only in making the Congressional Record more voluminous and soporific, are daily wasting valuable hours of congress. When there is so much legislation to be enacted it would be well if there was a little less free speech in congress.

COUNTRY WANTS THE FACTS.

Is it the purpose of the politicians at Washington to give the people the facts on the oil reserve scandal before the national conventions and the presidential election? Do the politicians prefer to belabor the issue, conceal the truth, confuse the voters, prolong the present get-nowhere tactics of congress and the congressional committees? Can the public expect eventually to receive a fair and complete hearing of the whole issue? The public is at the mercy of the politicians in the probe of the alleged corruption, as it appears to have been while the alleged corruption was in progress. Will the alleged probes be more merciful than the alleged grafters appear to have been?

Thus far the public has been given only rumor of the Vanderbilts and Roxie Stinson varieties. Weeks have been wasted by congress and the investigating committees on the questioning and re-questioning of persons who could not possibly furnish advantageous information or whose testimony could not be believed by decent citizens even if it contained a scintilla of truth. The voters are entitled to a verdict in the Teapot Dome before they are called upon to render a verdict next November.

Presumably congressmen here in Washington to represent the people. In the disposition of the oil scandal they have no moral or political right to consider self or party. Before next November the voters, regardless of political faith, will demand the evidence. They will want to know whether a
