Our surplus wealth is at the beck and call of the needy and the hard pressed, but real deeds of heroic abnegation are so infrequent that the newspapers make front page reading of them when they do occur. It is surprising that human beings loving honor as they do would not make self-sacrifice an everyday rule of conduct.

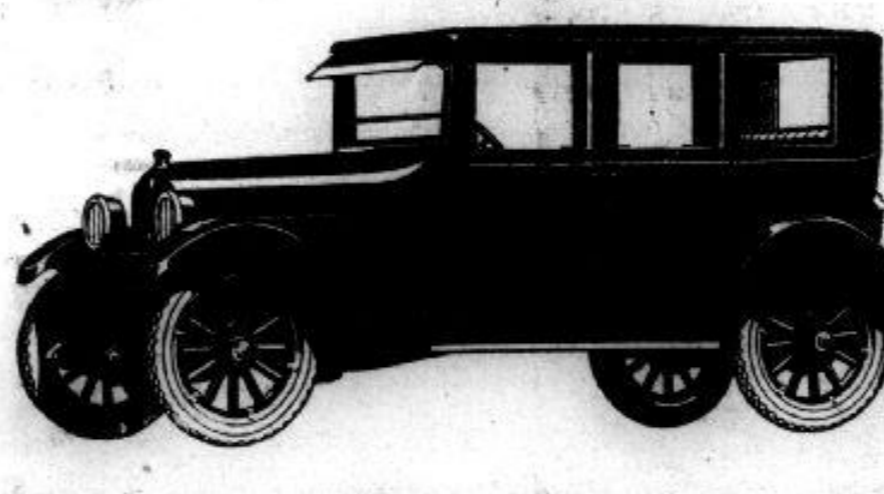

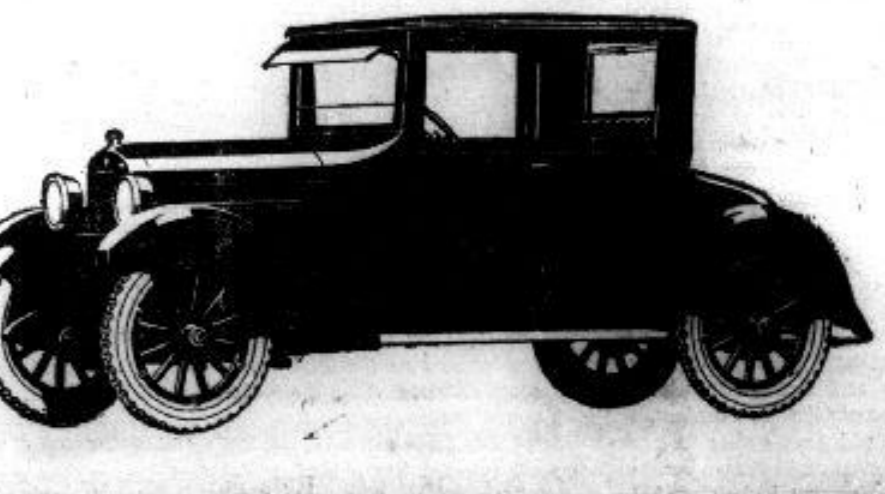
