HOW DO THEY KNOW IT?

A noted biologist has given it out that, in his opinion, there are, roughly, in this country 45,000,000 people, "who have no sense." The question which naturally arises is how he found it out and whether he includes everybody with the bunch or lines some up with himself and the bunch of highbrows who make it their business to catalogue and standardize others according to their own notions of what is sense and just how much of it every human ought to possess.

Every schoolboy has read how it was that the first Brutus of a noble and distinguished Roman family came by the name which he passed down to his descendants. The Roman highbrows thought he was a fool, and he was only fooling them. Brutus isnt' the only historical character who has thus been misjudged. There are others.

LEADERS AND WORKERS

The world hasn't much to be proud of in the way of eadership. The statesmen have talked much but have done little. Then the leadership set to work "reconstructing." Not a very good job of it was done.

Meanwhile times are getting better the world over. But it is not because of leadership. There has been very little constructive legislation which might be credited. What has happened?

The common people have gone to work. Under great difficulties they are beginning to till and make and trade and carry. It is very hard for them because the rules of the eaders are hindrances. "You must not trade with these; you must not buy of those; you must carry under such and such conditions, " says leadership. But even with the burdens of unwonted taxes and the restrictions of many rules and regulations, the workers are bringing back prosperity, There is a vast stamnia in the good old world, but it sorely needs wiser leadership.


