BIG BUSINESS NONPARTISAN

If the current congressional investigations have disclosed anything of real public worth it is the big business and rich men belong to neither the Republican nor the Democratic party, but to all parties—that the campaigns of both the major political parties are swayed by contributions from the same men of finance and business. It has been revealed to the public that the only partiality that big business is showing in politics is to itself.

Various federal statutes have been enacted in order to limit the amount that candidates for office may receive in seeking election, or to insure publicity of the accounts of political committees. Something has undoubtedly been gained in that way. But that there are remaining and serious evils in connection with raising money to conduct political campaigns few honest students of politics will deny.

No survey of the question can have any value unless it is fair and non-partisan. To start with, the fact has to be admitted that large amounts of money are necessary in managing a nation-wide campaign. The multiplication of primary elections, with their necessarily heavy expenditures, together with the granting of the suffrage to women, has directly tended to increase the outlay regarded as indispensable. Nor can there be any use in partisan recrimination on the subject.

How much can be done by statute or publicly to lessen the mischief is uncertain. But there is one form of voluntary remedy that might be applied. It would consist of a determination by rich men in either party not to expose themselves to suspicion, and by their necessary heavy expenditures, together with the granting of the suffrage to women, has directly tended to increase the outlay regarded as indispensable.

The condition observed in France during the world war furnishes a mystery that now bids fair to hold the attention of the people of the globe until solved. It involves questions of science. Countless others had seen the same thing, Newton himself had seen it often, but it was so common as not to have excited special interest. Finally it drove home its lesson to Newton. Savages for centuries had noticed water falls without any thought of their power that might be harnessed to useful purposes—power so vast in the aggregate that it is still scarcely tapped. One day some individual caught the message that the water-fall had for centuries been delivering.

In a world from which has come such wonders as the telephone and the wireless, we must realize that we constantly are in the midst of signs that would unlock mysteries for us if only we understood them. But some day, as in the case of Newton and the apple, they will be grasped, and new eras will result.

GLOOM CARRIERS

Our authoritative medicine man declares that certain people are "typhoid germ carriers." That means that, while they do not have typhoid themselves, they carry the germs about their person and communicate them to other people, hence they are a danger to public health.

Alphonse Cotter, a robust Belgian with rosy cheeks and apparent good health, conducted a bakeshop in New York. The Board of Health had him up before the Municipal Court and the Judge decided that he must keep away from the shop, that he could not handle breadstuffs, nor even sit at the cash register and make change for customers.

The reason for this was that, although it was some eighteen years ago that he had typhoid fever and was apparently cured, he was a typhoid germ carrier and should not be allowed to handle foodstuffs.

It came out in the trial that there are now some 119 persons being regularly inspected as carriers. One case cited was that of "Typhoid" Mary Fallon, who, several years ago, was adjudged a carrier. She had been employed as a domestic. She was ordered to choose some other line of work.

Dr. Blunt said that "Typhoid" Mary, under an assumed name, had been a patient in a hospital. After an epidemic of typhoid there the woman was identified as a carrier and, having broken the rule laid down by the Sanitary Code, she was given a sentence of "enforced supervision" for several years.

This all seems fair enough. The public health must be preserved, but, after all, we are not mere animals with bodies; we are spirits with minds. And, if the authorities look so carefully after those who carry germs that would destroy our bodies, why cannot some one look out for those souls who carry germs that bring disease to our spirits?

The health of the spirit of man may fairly be gauged by his courage, his cheer and his altruistic impulses. The spiritual diseases known as fear, cynicism, pessimism, despair and other varieties of gloom, spoil quite as many lives as typhoid fever, cancer and malaria.
