POLICEMAN JACK BYRNES of Utica, N. Y., saved seven persons by forcing illuminating gas out of their lungs and pumping in fresh air. Byrnes the night before sat at a lecture on resuscitation and watched the American Red Cross instructors demonstrate how to use the hands as pumping apparatus to start breathing that has been stopped by suffocation. One lecture upon an intelligent officer in this case rescued a woman who had been asphyxiated by a gas leak. The surgeon put Policeman Byrnes to work on a woman gas victim, and he had her breathing normally when she was carried into a hospital.
