JUST LIKE HIM

When a lady left \$75,000 worth of jewelry in a taxi cab the other day, the chauffeur, John Joseph Cody, turned it over to the police, didn't steal it, and forgot to tell his wife, he said.
'I didn't think anything about it.'
She said:
'That was just like John.'
A man's conscience works automatically, if he has one.
Instinctively, John Cody turned the valuables over to a policeman.

When news was brought to his wife she first asked: 'Has John been hurt?' and burst into tears of relief on being informed that all was well with John. Then she said: 'It was the only thing he could have done. But it was just like John. Won't his father and mother be proud of him? They are in Ireland, you know.'

As for John himself, he turned over the pigskin case containing \$75,000 worth of jewelry to the nearest policeman in an ordinary way as he could have turned over an umbrella that had been left behind.

Mrs. Cody has every reason to be proud of John. His action shows that he values his good name and the welfare of his family above any kind of reward. He has the quality that is demanded in every form of business and politics. We may talk as much as we please, but what is asked for is the presence of honesty and simplicity of character above the showiness of intelligence.

From the highest office in the land to the lowest, the demand is for conscience and a conscience that will work smoothly and automatically and not one that needs to be tutored up by reason.

For, after all, it is conscience that keeps the social compact together. It is conscience that keeps us all from quarreling continually like cats and dogs.

It is conscience that gives men faith in their leaders. The ability to make one's word as good as his bond is better than any other kind of ability.

It is conscience that is the rock upon which civilization is founded and the more it is developed the stronger is the fabric we have built.

However, if it is true that good may sometimes come out of evil, then it is possible that this may be one instance of verification of the adage. At least one of the self-confessed criminals has availed himself to be an atheist. Perhaps it may be developed that respect of religion training and sense of duty are factors in cultivating an exaggerated ego in the youthful criminal. Other lay followers of similar cases have ascribed absence of parental discipline as a contributory cause of degeneracy, not specifically in the Chicago case, but in many others that appear in the daily news calendar.

Many worthy men and women who recall their own youth feel that too much stress is laid upon the assumed right of so-called self-expression in the children of today. Then the question has been discussed as to whether or not abnormal precocity should be encouraged or discouraged. The proud parent or teacher may unconsciously administer unless the latter is super-human, distressing results may follow. So few of us observe the happy mean.

These are some of the things that the Chicago trial is expected to furnish as food for thought on the part of the serious minded who follow its progress.
