





These electrons are so small that billions of them can crowd tagether on a pin point. Yet electric sparks, electric currents and all other manifestations of electricity consists of electrons. Whenever you heat any sub stance in a vacuum electrons fi off in great numbers from off in great numbers from the surface of the substance much as drops of mud fly off from the rim of a revolving automobile wheel. Electrons fly off this way from the filament in the vacuum tube whenever the filament is heated. They pass through the meshes of the gride and hit against the plate.


