New York July 12.—"The season of 1925 will mark the end of my career as a major league manager," says Miller Huggins of the New York Americans, three-time pennant winner.

"I propose to retire at the close of this year. Possibly would if my club was going as well as it was a year ago, but it isn't."

"The Yankee team is beginning to turn around. I don't like to get out while it is hot, but I would much prefer to have over a strong club to my successor."

"In several departments of the game the club must be rebuilt, not to do in pitching."

"Good pitchers have made the Yankees; been a bad team in winning three pennants, but pitchers cannot go on forever."

The veteran members of the all-star pitcher staff that has done big things for my club are beginning to slip. The fact is that a couple of the vets are going back is very problematical."

Peters Have Run Their Race  
"Hoyt, one of the Yankees' stars, is a young man, and he is a veteran in the point of pitching experience."

"My club has not been very fortunate with the young material that has been picked up. Conditioning, the physical condition of the players, the place where the owner of the club goes to get and buy up the best pitchers, the minor league market affords the pitching staff of the Yankees must be overhauled."


"The club must also be given to the position of shortstop. Everett Scott, one of the greatest infielders of all time, is fast showing up. His great endurance record has exacted a certain toll."

Look to the Future Legs  
"Looking to the future, shortstop is one position that must be considered. A successor to Scott, who can step right in and fill the bill, will be necessary if the club is to continue to progress."

"As a matter of fact, the Yankees as a team are aging and must be given an infusion of new blood to carry on."

"It is going to be a tough battle to my club. If my club goes over, the great strain isn't going to help the condition of the veterans, particularly the pitchers."

"The Yankees are liable to be starting out in close of the present race. I don't want to quit a club when it's giving me a good rope, otherwise, it would be curtains for me at the finished of 1924."
