




DEDICATION

MANCHESTER HIGH SCHOOL HISTORY

Mr. Charles S. Cheney, Dr. O. B. Taylor, Mr. Leroy Z. Collins founders . . . Originated in 1893, called South Manchester High School . . . Fall term: Latin, Greek, French, or German, Geometry, Chemistry . . . Winter term: Latin, Greek, French, German, Trigonometry, Chemistry . . . fifty-two pupils were enrolled at the time . . . Work was done by five teachers: Mr. Fred A. Verplanck, principal and instructor in the sciences; Mr. A. E. Peterson, instructor in Latin and Greek; Miss Anna Brockee, instructor in Mathematics and German; Miss Jeanne Charlius, instructor in French; and Miss Mary G. Peabody, instructor in Literature . . . Classes were divided as follows: six senior pupils; three juniors; sixteen sophomores, and twenty-seven freshmen . . . Bothia School Literary Society formed in 1900 . . . 1904, started to build present high school . . . cooking and special courses in drawing added . . . 1911, stenography and typewriting offered . . . 1912, bookkeeping offered in business course . . . nurse preparatory course was organized in 1935 in response to the general revision of entrance requirements to training schools . . . during the past two decades personal economics, health, driver training, History of Latin America, Spanish, mechanical drawing, child development, and a music program have been offered . . . from 1935 to 1940 mid-year graduations occurred . . . 1935, the Spring Concert and the Outdoor Music Festival originated . . . early 1900's seven different curriculums were offered: college preparatory, commercial, general scientific, pre-trade, home economics, nurse's preparatory, and art . . . next ten years the high school was located in the old Ninth District School standing on the land now occupied by the Franklin, Recreation, and Barnard Buildings . . . 1904, moved into what is now called the Main Building . . . school grew so slowly that it wasn't until the school year 1939-1940 when top floor of the Barnard Building was given over to the high school . . . figures for each ten years indicated by the school population are as follows: 1893—fifty-two; 1903—one hundred twenty-one; 1913—two hundred thirty-seven; 1923—five hundred ninety-eight; 1933—thirteen hundred; 1943—fourteen hundred twenty; 1953—fifteen hundred forty-five . . . outstanding among teachers who have served on the faculty were Miss Harriet Condon, who retired in 1934; Mr. C. L. Wigren, a mathematics teacher who retired in 1954; Miss Elizabeth Olson, vice-principal who retired in 1952; Miss Helen Smith in 1953 retiring from Home Economics Dept.; Mr. Wilfred Clarke, Physical Education teacher, who retired in 1954, and Miss Carrie Spafard, Latin teacher, who retired in 1955 . . . The following have served as principals at M.H.S.: Mr. Fred A. Verplanck, 1893-'94; Mr. Arthur E. Peterson, 1894-1900; Mr. Harry C. Folsom, 1900-1904; Mr. Austin Savage, 1904-1915; Mr. John Backus, 1915-1917; Mr. Leland P. Knapp, 1917-1923; Mr. Clarence P. Quimby, 1923-1933; Mr. Arthur H. Illing, 1933-1935; and Mr. Edson M. Bailey, 1935— . . . ten years before the high school was established a Board of Education philosophy was stated in a report of the town of Manchester . . . according to this statement, "A heritage so valuable as our system of common schools should be held in highest esteem by each succeeding generation . . . All that can be done should be done to promote its efficiency and secure its advantages" . . . this policy has been followed through the years . . . few schools are so fortunate as to have had the guidance of superintendents such as Mr. Fred A. Verplanck, who for forty-two years ruled with rugged honesty, and Mr. Arthur H. Illing's twenty years of devoted perseverance . . . the strength of their character and devotion to the development of Manchester boys and girls were reflected in all its successes.
