





The School Day Begins With a Journey . . .







Moods Are Moments Memories Are Made Of...





Student Council Is Our Training Ground for Democracy . . .





Linguistics to Literature Taught in English . . .

The English Department, with Mr. Hunt as department head, has started many new programs this year. A new system of teaching combines linguistics and grammar by use of over-head transparencies which allow the teacher to direct the attention of the students to the particular line being discussed. Speech classes, supervised by Mrs. Prevost and Mr. Gibbons, have been started with the future hope of incorporating these into the regular English classes. Under the direction of Mr. Gibbons, the English Department began this year the presentation of films involving literature covered in classes. Trips to the Stratford theater are sponsored, which this year offered the opportunity to see such plays as **Twelfth Night, Caesar, and Henry IV.**





New Math Course Offered . . .

For college preparatory students the mathematics department offers the standard high school courses of algebra, geometry, and trigonometry as well as math analysis and a new course in sets, probability, and statistics. Accelerated students have the opportunity of taking a full year of college Calculus under the University of Connecticut co-operative plan. Those who qualify obtain six credits at the University.

For non-college bound students a basic math, algebra and geometry are taught. Those girls preparing for nursing may take the Nurses' Math course; while the student preparing to enter the business world may select Business Math.

A prize is given after each year to the outstanding math student in the Senior class. This prize is offered by the United Aircraft, and awarded on the basis of excellency and superior performance in all mathematics courses taken.





The Physical Education Department, directed by Miss Julia Case, provides a varied and full program for the students at M.H.S. 

Practical Education Paves the Way for Tomorrow . . .

The Home Economics Department, supervised by Mrs. Pyne, covers a wider field than the traditional cooking and sewing. The courses also include units on family relations, advertisement evaluating, and home furnishing. Senior girls enrolled in the child development classes work with youngsters in the classroom and supervise playschools each week. Another activity of this department is the yearly presentation of a fashion show.

The new state regulation on obtaining a driver's license has put an even greater stress on the facilities of the Driver Education Department, headed by Mr. Norman Wilcox. More students than ever before now receive instruction in the classroom phase of the Driver Ed. classes. Here they learn the basics of the automobile while studying Connecticut laws and the values and habits of good drivers. 






“Send Me a Man Who Reads . . .”

For 29 years George Dougherty served our community and our school. His untimely death in the fall of 1965 was a distinct loss to us all. Mr. Dougherty was best known for his talents as coach of the MHS Debating Team for the last 25 years. The impact of his personal qualities will linger on in the hearts and minds of his students and friends.

With Mr. Guadano as department head, the Language Department at MHS offers courses in French, Spanish, Latin, and German. Each of these has its own special item of interest ranging from building Roman houses for Latin and reading vivid Spanish novels to learning German songs and dining at French restaurants. This year the language lab has been put to constant use by first and second year students. Lab sessions are usually held once or twice a week for half of a class period. The first year classes have been widely reorganized by the use of a new method of speaking, listening, and constant repetition of the language. The one desire of the language teachers is that this method be started earlier in school. This would enable the students to obtain a better understanding of the language and to feel more at ease with it in more advanced courses.


M.H.S. Offers Much for the Hobby-minded Student . . .

The debate club, along with its advisor Mr. Gibbons, travels all over the state. Practice debates for both novice and varsity teams prepare them for interscholastic debates.












Students Exhibit Physical Grace and Skill . . .










